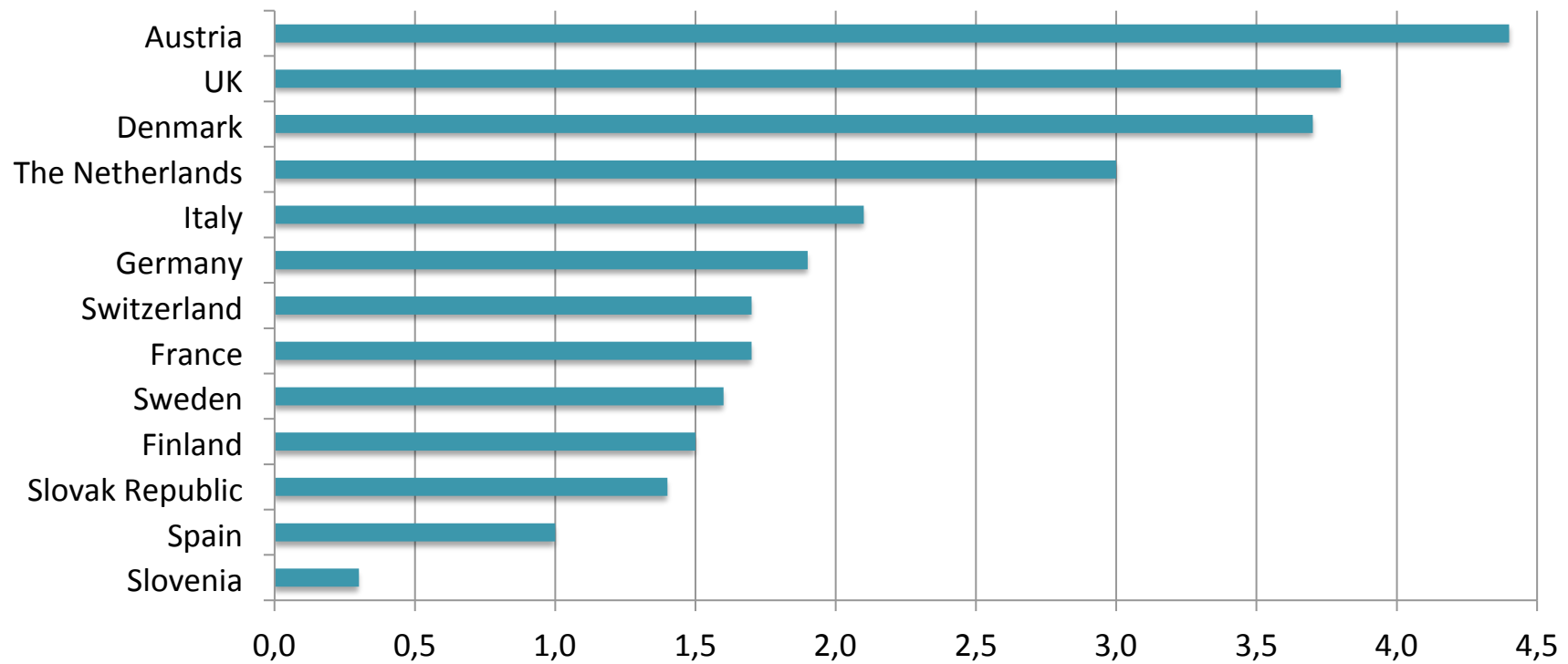


Ratio of older people in residential care as against users receiving home care services (latest available year)
