

# About 800 Everyday Companions have been trained since 2002 of which

- 80% are working in care homes
- 10% in community care services
- 10% in private practice (self-employed)


Since 2007 the training of Everyday Companions is provided by the Institute for Innovative Qualification – IQA




## Structure of training

- Written exam rated by an independent certification agency





### Competent everyday assistance ...

- ... animates all senses
- ... provides physical activation
- ... works with the social environment
- ... operates socially (me-you relation)
- ... works with emotions (responds to emotions of the person with dementia and triggers emotions)
- ... works biographically (using elements from the biography and relates it to the present)
- ... questions usual norms of civilisation



# Evidence for a direct impact on the quality of life of people with dementia

- less fear
- less stress
- more trust
- more vitality
- more smiles
- better nutrition
- more social contacts
- less pharmaceuticals
- less hospital stays



## **Challenges**

- Qualified Everyday Companions are not yet an acknowledged profession
- Funding and low payment
- Difficulty to delineate care and everyday assistance (use of Everyday Companions for care tasks)



### **Conclusions**

- For practice: defined division of labour between care professionals and Everyday Companions
- For policy: implementation of a one-year education with statutory accreditation
- For research: effects of Everyday Companions' work in dementia care on health costs
